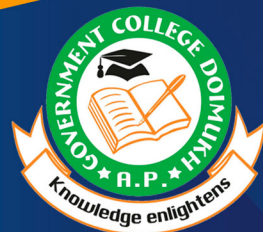

WHY CHOOSE GOVERNMENT COLLEGE DOIMUKH:

There are numerous and favourable reasons to choose Government College Doimukh which has created a niche for itself in its decade long existence, partly because of its proximity to the state Capital and to Rajiv Gandhi University. Some of which are described here:

- **Beauty of the Campus:**

Government College Doimukh is housed in the lap of nature surrounded by lush green mountains. The College has peaceful calm and serene environment replete with greenery and fresh air conducive for teaching and learning activities.

- **Good Connectivity:**

The College is well connected from all sides as it is located adjacent to Midpu tri-junction. The students from Yupia, Doimukh, Nirjuli and Naharlagun can get enrolled in this College and avail the College bus service or travel by their own conveyance. The other advantage of studying in this college is that it is located in close proximity to Rajiv Gandhi University which is within 15 minutes drive.

- **Plastic Free Zone:**

Government College Doimukh has been declared Plastic Free Zone since 22nd April 2018.

- **Girls' Hostel:**

The college provides accommodation to 40 meritorious girls students. The hostel is equipped with all basic amenities/facilities. The Selection criteria will be based on merit basis with preference to catchment area. Semester-wise seats allocation are as under:

First semester – 10

Third semester – 10

Fifth semester – 15

Seventh semester - 5

- **Library Facility:**

College Library has a total collection of above 3000 volumes consisting of textbooks, references and journals. The library subscribes to national, regional and local news papers besides a few magazines and journals. Well-developed reading space for students and faculties are available in library. Membership of the library is open to all Bonafide students and employees of the College. Library is open on all working days from 9 am to 4 pm.

- **College Canteen:**

The College has a canteen for the Students and the Faculty of the College. It provides

light refreshment, nutritious and hygienic food at affordable price. Canteen remains open on all working days.

- **NSS Unit:**

The College has a 2 Units with the strength of 100 each of National Service Scheme (NSS) to nurture and develop the personality of the students through community services with a motto “not me but you”. The students are required to fill up the prescribed form to become NSS Volunteers who shall be awarded certificate on successful completion of stipulated period/years as an active volunteer. The NSS Unit undertakes regular activities like observation of international/national important days, awareness on health & hygiene, cleanliness drive, social service, etc. The volunteers are also exposed to an annual special camp in an adopted village as part of NSS annual activities.

- **NCC Unit:**

The College has a Senior Division (SD) and Senior Wing (SW) with cadet strength of 50 each Unit of National Cadet Corps (NCC) to nurture and develop the personality of the students through services with a motto “Unity and Discipline”. The students are required to fill up the prescribed form to become NCC Cadets who shall be awarded certificate on successful completion of stipulated period/years as an active cadet.

- **Distance Education Cell:**

The College has a center of Distance Education Institute (IDE) of RGU for students who want to opt for Bachelor of Arts in distance mode of studies. The syllabus of IDE is in accordance to that of Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU), Rono Hills.

- **Career Counselling and Guidance:**

Career Counselling and Guidance Cell facilitate information access and dissemination of knowledge regarding career options, scholarship/fellowship and job opportunity in different fields through seminar and workshop. The Cell seeks to open new vista of interest for students to diversify their goals and objectives thereby add value to education.

- **Internal Quality Assurance Cell:**

With an intention of maintaining and imbibing high standards of quality education in both academic as well as extra-academic activities, Internal Quality Assurance Cell is being established in the College. The IQAC shall endeavour for promotion of quality in teaching-learning process through self-evaluation, accountability, innovations and prepares Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) thereby create quality sustenance in the College.

- **College Disciplinary Committee:**

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION: BA/B.COM - I SEMESTER

An applicant seeking admission in BA/B.Com First Semester must have passed AISSCE (10+2) or any equivalent examinations from a recognised Board/University with five papers including English as a compulsory paper.

1. The Applicant must have appeared in CUET (UG) 2026 and secured minimum 40% (in aggregate) in Class XII for candidates belonging to Catchment area. However, the applicant from non-catchment area must secured 45% and above. All admission will be done strictly on the basis of Rajiv Gandhi University Norms issued from time to time.
2. Admission of students without CUET (UG) 2026 will be considered ONLY in case of unfilled vacancies in any of the departments and strictly as per RGU/Govt. guidelines.
3. Admission will be considered as per the catchment norms issued by the Government of Arunachal Pradesh. Preference will be given to those candidates who belong to Papum Pare District. However, some seats (as prescribed by the Government) as given above will be allowed to candidates from non-catchment area purely on the basis of merit.
4. For B.A. I Semester, a total of 05 (five) seats are reserved for Differently-Abled People (PWD), National Level Sports Person, Certified NSS & NCC volunteers of Arunachal Pradesh irrespective of the catchment area.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING ONLINE ADMISSION FORM

Applicants are advised to follow the following steps for filling up online admission form of B.A/B.Com. Semester I:

1. Visit the college website <https://gcdmk.ac.in>
2. On the home page click the tab for Online Admission.
3. Select the desired course B.A/B.Com. from the Select Program under the Apply for Admission tab.
4. Enter your mobile number and click Send New OTP (Note: do not use the phone number of your parents or guardians. The same mobile number shall be used by the

institution for communication till the completion of course).

5. Enter the OTP received and click Proceed that will lead you to the online admission form.
6. After filling up all the necessary details in the form, Click Next button. A confirmation page will appear where in you must check all the details filled.
7. After verifying the details filled, click on "I Accept" and then click the Confirm Button.
8. For completing the form, the applicant must pay the online application fee on the payment page by using Debit/Credit Card or Net Banking/UPI/GPay mode. There is no provision for offline payment of application fees.
9. The college is NOT liable to refund any extra money remitted during the process of admission.

2. Marks sheet of Class XII in original with two self-attested photocopies.
3. Transfer certificate (Original) from the institution last attended. (Mandatory)
4. Migration certificate in original with one self-attested photo copy for candidates coming from schools outside of Arunachal Pradesh as well as Boards other than CBSE.
5. CUET Score card.
6. ABC id Card.
7. ST/SC certificate (one) self-attested photocopy.
8. Character certificate from the institution last attended.
9. Recent passport size photographs- 5 copies for APST & 4 copies for Non APST (Name & class to be written on the back of each photo).
10. One photocopy of Aadhar card.
11. One photocopy of PRC self-attested (only for candidates of catchment areas)
12. One photocopy of Parent Income Certificate.

(Note: All original documents are to be produced at the time of admission for verification)

B.A/B.Com II/III/IV/V/VI/ VII/VIII SEMESTERS:

1. Student seeking admission in B.A/B.Com II/III/IV/V/ VI/ VII/VIII Semesters should have passed in the corresponding lower examinations conducted by RGU.
2. Those students who are placed under the category of pass with back paper (PWBP) can also seek for admission.

Documents Required:

1. Marks sheet of last qualifying exams, two self-attested photocopies.
2. University Registration Card (one) self-attested photocopy.
3. ST/SC certificate (one) self-attested photocopy.
4. Five copies of recent passport size photograph with name & class written on the back of each photo.

Documents required for Filling up of University Examination Forms

1. College Identity Card (one) self-attested photocopy.
2. University Registration Card (one) self-attested photocopy.
3. Marks sheet of last qualifying exams (two) self-attested photocopies.
4. Three photo copies of recent passport size photograph with name & class written on the back of each photo.

GENERAL RULES/REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES:

1. A Student must attend 75% of lecture delivered in each subject/paper failing which he/she will be disqualified from appearing end semester examination and also forfeit claims for stipend (APST student). Student's attendance will be monitored and reviewed every month.
2. Sessional tests are compulsory and a student must secure minimum qualifying marks as prescribed by RGU. Those who fail/absent in sessional tests will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examinations.
3. Students are instructed to fill up admission/examination form by themselves with utmost care. Students will be solely responsible for any wrong entry of information related to subject, paper title, paper code etc that may lead to rejection/ cancellation of candidature.
4. A student may apply for re-checking of answer book(s) in a prescribed format as per RGU notification.

Library Rules:

1. To become a member, one has to apply in a prescribed form which can be collected from library branch and accordingly Library Card will be issued for borrowing of books.
2. Students can borrow three books at a time for two weeks while faculty member can borrow five books at a time for a period of two weeks.
3. In the event of late return or loss/damage of book, a prescribed fine will be invariably charged.
4. All members are expected to abide by the library rules and regulations enforced from time to time.

NEW EDUCATION POLICY (NEP) 2020:

The Four-year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) offers a plethora of courses under Major, Minor, Multidisciplinary, Value-added Course, Skill Enhancement Course, and Research components. There is facility for multiple exit and entry options are available in the FYUP 2020 programme. This option has the scope to provide the learners with the requisite space to exit and resume their program in protracted steps. It offers students with an option to exit with, a UG Certificate (on successful completion of 2 semesters/1

year with 40 credits), a UG Diploma (on successful completion of 4 semesters / 2 years) and a UG Degree (on successful completion of 6 semesters / 3 years) and moreover, a UG Degree with Honours/ Research (on successful completion of 8 semesters / 4 years). All students will also undergo Internship / Apprenticeship during the summer term after the completion of End Semester Examination of fourth semester.

If a candidate acquires 3 years UG Degree, he/she is eligible for 2 years PG programme. If a candidate acquires 4 years Degree with Honours/Research, he/she is eligible for 1 year PG programme. If a candidate successfully completes 4 years (8 semesters) Degree (Honours/Research) with 8CGPA, he /she is eligible to get admission in Ph.D programme.

Therefore, the FYUP syllabus is framed to promote critical thinking and enhance skill. The final year of the four-year undergraduate programme will be research-centric.

Instructions:

- A student seeking admission in Arts stream can choose ONE subject each from amongst the following options as **Major** and **Minor**.

(Please note that Major and Minor cannot be the same subject)

- 1) Economics
- 2) English
- 3) Education
- 4) Geography
- 5) Hindi
- 6) History
- 7) Political Science
- 8) Sociology.

- Students also have to select one subject as **Multi-Disciplinary Course (MDC)**, a subject which was not studied in Class XII.

(Please note that Major and Multi-Disciplinary Course (MDC) cannot be the same subject)

- Following subjects are available to opt as **Multi-Disciplinary Course (MDC)** -

- 1) Economics
- 2) Education
- 3) Hindi
- 4) Sociology
- 5) MDC Commerce

- The **Skill Enhancement Course** will be from opted Major subject only.
- The **Ability Enhancement Course** will be English/Hindi Compulsory.
- The **Value-Added Course** will be Environmental Science (EVS) mandatory to all.

- The End Term Examination will be conducted for a total of 80 marks.
- Thus, the Paper will be evaluated out of 100 marks, comprising 20 marks from the internal and 80 marks from the End Term Examinations.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

1. Admission in the college implicitly implies the adherence/agreement to all rules/regulations/guidelines framed from time to time so as to create congenial/peaceful conducive academic environment in the College.
2. Students are expected to maintain peace, tranquility, communal harmony and universal brotherhood in all respect.
3. Students are to exhibit strict discipline and abide by the rules that govern them. Any breach of discipline/rule or violence/assault will invite strict action including expulsion from the college as per guidelines laid down by the Disciplinary, Grievance and Redressal Cell.
4. Students ought to be disciplined, mannered and polite in their dealing/conduct with the members of the college community in particular and the people in general.
5. Students must be helpful and polite to the guests/visitors of the college. The guests/visitors should be extended with assistance in whatever way possible.
6. Students should actively participate in all functions/programmes including Annual College Day and other co-curricular/extracurricular activities.
7. Students should display high moral ethics especially during examinations by not indulging in any unfair-means and breach of discipline which will invite severe punishment as per examination norms.

8. Students must maintain silence during working hours. They should desist from disturbing in library/classroom/office by talking or gossiping loudly and loitering along the veranda or corridors or nearby Principal's Chamber.
9. Students must endeavour to keep the College compound neat and clean. They should not indulge in defacing the College walls or buildings by spitting, slogan writing, pasting poster, etc.
10. Students are expected to gather all relevant information from Notice Board to be notified from time to time.
11. It is mandatory for all the students to produce clearance certificate from library/storekeeper/NSS/NCC, etc. for issuance of University Admit Card/Certificate and Caution Money.
12. Use of any intoxicated substance such as alcohol, tobacco, cigarette, gutka, tiranga, etc. are strictly prohibited. Mobile phone is strictly prohibited inside the and examination hall.
13. Students must maintain proper dress code reflecting all decency and etiquette. Any type of vulgarity and indecent dress will not be permitted.
14. Ragging in any form/manner is strictly prohibited. Any student indulging in ragging will attract punishment as per the law of the land as directed from the Supreme Court of India.
15. Any divisive activity/forces based on caste, creed, communal, race, religion, region, etc. by an individual/group or organisation (s) will not be tolerated. Strict action will be initiated against the defaulter.
16. It will attract severe punishment if a student is found spreading rumour, false and fabricated information against College in any social media such as Facebook, WhatsApp, twitter etc. Such offenders shall not only be booked under the act of cybercrime but also be expelled from the institution.
17. College Uniform: In order to instil and cultivate discipline, unity, integrity, oneness or sense of belongingness and also for easy identification of students, college uniform has been introduced. The students (all classes) are required to wear college uniform during four days in a week i.e. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Apart from this, students are expected to come invariably in college uniform during the official function/program.

STUDENT SUPPORT SCHEMES:

With an aim of building overall personality development of the students apart from academics, the following student support schemes are available to them.

➤ **Principal's Merit Award:**

Every year, Principal's Merit Award is given to overall subject toppers of the college. The Award comprises a certificate, memento and cash amount of Rs 5000.

➤ **Stipend and Book Grant:** A financial aid in the form of stipend and book grant is given to all the Bonafide students belonging to Schedule Tribes of Arunachal Pradesh. The financial aid/scholarship is subject to the following terms and conditions prescribed by the Government of Arunachal Pradesh:

1. A student must apply in a prescribed form for availing of financial aid within a stipulated time to be notified separately.
2. Grant of stipend totally depends on the consistent good conduct and satisfactory academic progress (without academic arrear) of the stipendiary. If the stipendiary is found guilty of misconduct such as resorting to or participating in the strike, violence, irregular in attendance, remains absent without permission of the authority or commits any major offence or breach of peace and discipline, the Principal has the power to suspend the award of stipend.
3. The Government shall have the inherent right to cancel the stipend wholly or partly or stop or withhold further payment of stipend for a period for reasons enumerated in Para 2 above or for any reasons which the Government thinks proper as per rule.
4. Students engaged in job of any nature cannot claim/avail stipend.
5. If a student is found to have obtained stipend by false statement, the stipend paid will be recovered and student concerned will be blacklisted and debarred of stipend forever.
6. A stipendiary must have bank account preferably in SBI for credit/payment of stipend. Under no circumstances, the stipend money will be paid on cash.
7. The stipendiary must attend minimum (75%) required attendance in the class. In the event of less attendance and failure in the exams, the stipend of such student will be stopped forthwith and the same will be refunded to the Government accordingly.

➤ **College Bus Service:** The College has a two buses service for students and employees of the College. The bus shall ply to & fro from the College campus to Naharlagun via Nirjuli on all working days. For availing bus service, a concessional fee/fare must be paid by the commuters for fuel and maintenance of the College bus, per academic session.

➤ **Educational Excursion:** A Bonafide student (APST) can avail an opportunity to visit important places of India on educational excursion conducted every year. Funded by the state government, the selection for excursion is done purely on merit basis amongst the Final year/sixth semester students (Academic performance and good behaviour).

➤ **Geography Field Trip:** The Government provides financial assistance to conduct Geography field trip as per the syllabus provided by RGU.

- **Clubs and Group Activities:** The College encourages the formation of student clubs under the Guidance of the teaching staff. The clubs are literary and cultural, information and games and sports. Literary and cultural club encourages and promotes related activities such as debates, seminars, workshops, singing, dancing, music etc. Games and sports club facilitate to explore and develop talents among the students in Games and sports.
- **Students' Union:** In order to promote and develop the democratic spirit, functioning and Leadership quality among the students, the college constitutes a general body of all regular enrolled students which shall be known as Government College Doimukh Students' Union. The students' union devotes on the student activities and their welfare in the college. The Principal, Government College Doimukh is an Ex-officio President of the Students' Union. The Students' Union must function in unison with all stakeholders of the college and always seek aid and advice from its Adviser. The Principal being the Ex-officio President shall have the power to dissolve the Union if any objectionable or untenable activities brought to the notice. The Election of Students' Union will be conducted as per the recommendation of Lyngdoh Committee Report which has been explicitly reflected in the bye-law of the Students' Union. **It may be noted that the upper age limit according to Lyngdoh Committee is 21 years. No candidature will be entertained who exceeds the prescribed age even by a day at the time of filing the nomination paper.**

- General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Asst. Cultural Secretary, Games & Sports Secretary, Asst. Games & Sports Secretary, Literary Secretary, Asst. Literary Secretary, Social Secretary, Asst. Social Secretary, Editor College Magazine (Nominated).
- **Co-curricular Activities:** Besides the academic advancement of the students, the college also encourages them in different co-curricular activities during the academic session. Various games & sports, cultural, literary, social service activities are organised and outstanding students in each field are awarded with prizes and certificates during the Annual College Day function.
- **Extra-curricular Activities:** College has NCC and NSS units for students to take participation as cadet and volunteers. Such certificate provides immense endeavours in their career.
- **Travelling Concession:** Students are eligible to avail Railway Concession during winter & summer vacation and educational excursion. They may obtain concession from nearest railway station for to & fro journey to their home town and for excursion.
